Solidarity Statement on Old-Growth Forests

The <u>Canadian Association of Nurses for the Environment</u> (CANE) and the <u>Canadian Nurses Association</u> (CNA) expresses support for the Union of BC Indian Chiefs (UBCIC) <u>Protect Our Elder Trees Declaration</u>, the <u>Indigenous Climate Action's Statement on Fairy Creek Raids</u>, and the provincial government's <u>2020 Old-Growth Strategic Review</u> which call for the immediate deferral of logging in all highly productive old-growth forests in British Columbia.

CNA and CANE represents nurses from across Canada, and we echo the <u>UBCIC's call</u> to end old-growth logging in the interest of Indigenous rights, biodiversity conservation, climate change mitigation, the health of all peoples, and the ecosystems upon which life depends. <u>The environmental movement in Canada</u> has perpetuated ongoing colonialism and ecological injustices against Indigenous peoples. In recognition of this unjust history, CANE and CNA support policies that promote <u>Indigenous-led forest stewardship</u>, <u>conservation financing</u>, and <u>a just transition</u> for communities reliant on old-growth logging.

For the health of BC residents and the land, climate change mitigation is needed now, and old-growth forests are essential in this endeavour. <u>Old-growth forests</u> store carbon, resist wildfires, are home to vulnerable plant and animal species (including wild salmon), and provide vital ecological services like water filtration. We live in a time where runaway wildfires impact the health of BC residents, of <u>increasing heat-related deaths</u>, and severe drought. It is clear that climate change mitigation strategies are desperately needed, and protecting the remaining old-growth forest is <u>one crucial strategy</u> that is right at hand.

Climate change is an ecological <u>public health emergency</u>. In the interest of climate change mitigation and climate justice, we call on the provincial government to follow through on their promises to protect old-growth forests, support Indigenous-led forest stewardship, and transition to a truly sustainable forestry industry.
